I had the pleasure of sitting with the legendary vocal teacher and singer Sal Dupree, and he shared with me 7 powerful elements that he instills into each of his students at The Dupree Performing Arts Studios. Read what he says.....



- 1. Keep your mind and body healthy: The business is very physical in the sense that there is hours and hours of practice and developing your craft. You should stay away from distractions that hinder you from reaching your goal.
- 2. Learn How To Package Yourself: It is very important to stand out. Blending does not make superstars. Look for unique ways to STAND OUT with your look and vocal technique. I recommend a great book called, "The Presentation Secret's of Steve Jobs". It will teach you how to be great in front of any crowd guaranteed.
- 3. Be Unique & Real: You never want to sell yourself as something your not. You may be able to fool the public once but it wont work twice. To have staying power like the Barbara Streisand, Celine Dion & Madonna's you have to be honest and true to who you are. Sal Say's, "One of the main reasons my students of all ages and races love Adele is the fact that her beautiful voice & phrasing combined with her songwriting ability makes her a superstar. No one sounds like Adele, she is unique!"
- 4. Work The Internet: Facebook, Youtube & Twitter should be used properly to market your brand. You want to make sure your offering value to your fans and not just pushing product by it self. You should be looking to connect with fans worldwide.
- 5. Master Your Core Skills: It's very important that you practice your butt off and make sure you study the legends you admire.
- 6. Choose The Right Team: Its very important that you find the right manager, agent, artist developer, etc. You need to have that one special person in your corner who loves and trust's you and your talents and wants to be apart from day one. This will keep you in a positive zone because you have (TEAM SUPPORT).
- 7. Be Humble & Give Thanks: Make sure you never forget where you come from and always give thanks to the Higher Power you believe in for your gifts and opportunities. Sal says, "The most important thing to remember is that the entire WORKING world of entertainment is made up of only 8% of the worlds population. Those figures are staggering and humbling when you think about it. We are all blessed to be doing what we are doing in the Arts. Never forget it!"

Sal has a great saying in a frame on the wall just behind his desk and I agree with him. It says, If you've got any talent thats God's gift to you, If you use that talent thats your gift back to God.
